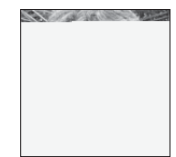
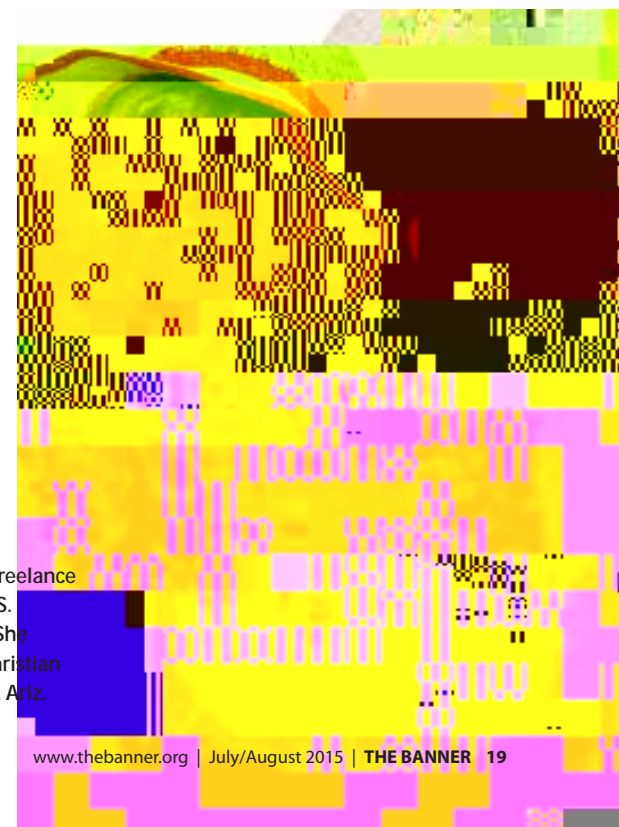
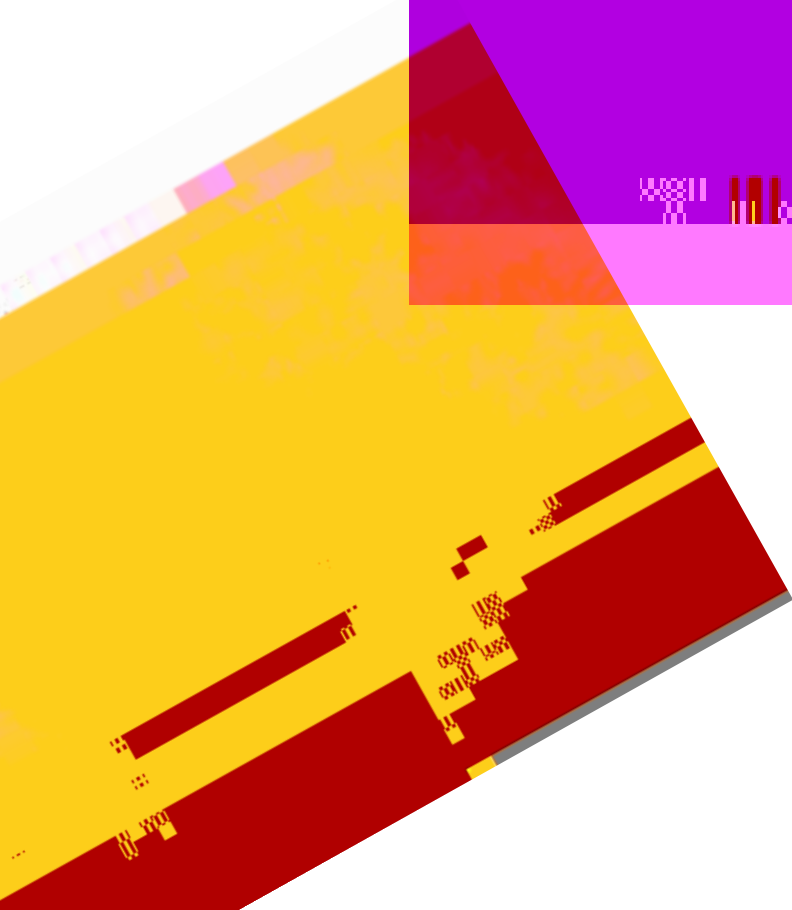
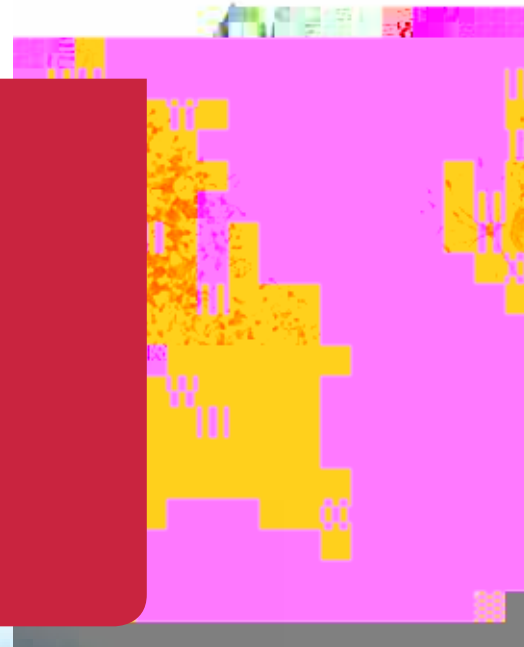


Do plants talk? Yep! They talk to each other, they talk to animals, and they even talk to bugs. Even though plants don't use words like we do, they give messages loud and clear.
